**ORDINANCE 23-12**

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the Mayor and Township Council of the Township of Jackson, County of Ocean, and State of New Jersey, as follows:

**SECTION 1:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-8 entitled “Meetings of Council,” subsection A. which shall read as follows:

A. Regular meetings. The Council shall meet annually for organization on the first day of January at 12:00 noon or at some other hour on any day during the first week of January. The Council shall designate by resolution the time of the holding of regular meetings, which shall be at least monthly.

**SECTION 2:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-36 entitled “Office established; appointment,” subsection B. which shall read as follows:

B. Appointment and term of office. The Tax Assessor shall be appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Township Council, for a term of four years commencing on January 1 next following appointment.

**SECTION 3:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-37 entitled “Deputy Tax Assessor,” subsection B. which shall read as follows:

B. Appointment and term of office. The Deputy Tax Assessor shall be appointed by the Mayor, with the advice and consent of the Township Council, for a term of four years commencing on January 1 next following appointment.

**SECTION 4:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-106 entitled “Appointment of Police Physicians,” which shall read as follows:

Each Police Physician shall be appointed by the Township Council for the term of one year, beginning on the first day of January of the year for which the appointment shall be made. To be eligible, the appointee must be duly licensed under the laws of the State of New Jersey for the general practice of medicine.

**SECTION 5:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-143 entitled “Court Administrator; term, appointment; duties,” which shall read as follows:

There shall be a Court Administrator who shall be appointed by the Mayor with the advice and consent of Township Council. The Court Administrator shall serve for a term of three years from January 1 of the year in which he or she is appointed and until a successor is appointed and qualified. The Court Administrator shall supervise and administer the work of the Municipal Court, subject to the direction of the Judges and applicable statutes and Court rules, and act as the Clerk of said Court according to statute and the rules of Court.

**SECTION 6:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-147 entitled “Environmental Commission,” subsections B. and D. which shall read as follows:

B. Membership. The Commission shall consist of seven members appointed by the Mayor, one of whom shall also be a member of the Planning Board and all of whom shall be residents of the Township of Jackson. The members shall serve without compensation. The Mayor shall annually designate one of the members to serve as Chairman and presiding officer of the Commission. The terms of office of each member shall commence on January 1 of the year of appointment and shall e for a term of three years, to expire on December 31 of the third year. A vacancy occurring otherwise than by the expiration of the term shall be filled for the unexpired term in the same manner as an original appointment.

D. Alternate members. In addition to the regular members, the Environmental Commission shall have two alternate members, designated as “Alternate No. 1” and “Alternate No. 2.” The terms of the alternate members shall be for two years. A vacancy occurring otherwise than by the expiration of the term shall be filled by the appointing authority for the unexpired term only. The terms of alternate members shall commence on January 1 of the year of appointment and expire on June 30 of the second year.

**SECTION 7:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-150 entitled “Planning Board,” subsection B(3). which shall read as follows:

(3) The terms of all Class IV members first appointed pursuant to this chapter shall be so determined that, to the greatest extent practicable, the expiration of such terms shall be evenly distributed over the first four years after their appointment, provided, however, that no term of any member shall exceed four years, and further provided that nothing herein shall affect the terms of any present members of the Planning Board, all of whom shall continue in office until the completion of the terms for which they were appointed. Thereafter, all Class IV members shall be appointed for terms of four years, except as otherwise herein provided. All terms shall run from January 1 of the year in which the appointment was made.

**SECTION 8:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-154 entitled “Terms of members; manner of appointment; number of members,” subsection A. which shall read as follows:

A. Have a term for one year, commencing January 1 and terminating on December 31 of that year; and

**SECTION 9:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-157 entitled “Terms of office; vacancies; participation by alternates,” subsection A. which shall read as follows:

A. All appointments to the Americans with Disabilities Act Advisory Board shall be for a term of one year, commencing January 1 of the year of appointment and ending on December 31 of the year of appointment. A vacancy on the Board occurring other than by expiration of term shall be filled for the unexpired term by the Mayor.

**SECTION 10:** The Township Code of the Township of Jackson is hereby amended and supplemented so as to amend Chapter 3 entitled “Administrative Code” so as to amend § 3-159 entitled “Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Coordinator,” subsection E. which shall read as follows:

E. The term of office for the ADA Coordinator and Deputy ADA Coordinator shall be for one year, commencing on January 1 of the year of appointment and ending on December 31 of the year of appointment.

**SECTION 11:** If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

**SECTION 12:** This ordinance shall take effect after the second reading and publication as required by law.

2. That the Mayor and the Township Clerk are hereby authorized to execute a contract with Waste Management of New Jersey, Inc. in accordance with the bid submitted by Waste Management of New Jersey, Inc. per the attached "Schedule A".

3. That the contract shall be an open-ended contract with funds being encumbered contingent upon the availability of funds in the budget year. No purchases and/or services shall be placed and/or rendered under the contract until the Chief Financial Officer has certified the availability of funds for such purchases and/or services.

4. That the contract term shall be for four (4) years with an option to renew for one (1) additional one (1) year period.

5. That a certified copy of this resolution, together with a copy of the contract between the parties, shall be forwarded to Waste Management of New Jersey, Inc., Township Administrator, Director of Public Works, Chief Financial Officer, Purchasing Department, Central Jersey Waste & Recycling, Inc. and any other interested parties.

**DISCUSSION AGENDA:**

**1. ADMINISTRATOR TORRES:**

- a. E-Waste Disposal contract award – A change in legislation was imposed with the recycling of electronic equipment. The Administration would like to place, on the next Agenda, an award of contract to a firm in Jackson, which would pay us the greatest return on our electronics equipment. Also, the Jackson residents would be able to purchase re-furbished electronic equipment at 50% off. Council President Bressi asked a resolution be ready for the next meeting.

**PUBLIC COMMENT, ANY TOPIC**

**RICHARD SHAW – 62 OAKMONT LANE** – A number of Westlake residents are asking for Township assistance in modifying existing zoning for PRC communities, which presently prohibits the installation of a permanent natural gas emergency generator. We have been refused permits based upon the interpretation of the present ordinance. Council President Bressi explained it was discussed at the last meeting and we're looking into it. My initial response was maybe we should amend it. I went to a Planner, an Engineer and our Township Attorney and their initial response was not to change it. There are different specifications for each and every generator. If you leave your phone number with Attorney Kelly he will relay it to Attorney Cipriani, who is not present this evening and is in charge of heading it up.

Mr. Shaw asked what if new generators were designed with fireproof enclosures to be able to be set closer to combustible surfaces? Council President Bressi stated one of those problems is we could not put one brand for those specifications in an ordinance. It would have to apply to all whole-house generators. One might require a 25-foot set back and we

have a 20 ft setback. We would have to pick a number suitable to all gated communities. The odds are if we picked a number, none of you would meet that requirement and would still have to come in for a variance. It is being looked at whole-heartedly and, most likely, we will have an answer by the next meeting.

Councilman Kafton asked if their bi-laws address these generators? Mr. Shaw answered they do not. Councilman Kafton commented that someone in a single-family development could put in a generator but a home in the PRC zone could not. Council President Bressi explained because the structures are close. In a R1 or R3 zone there could be several hundred feet between homes. Councilman Kafton can understand the noise issue and Council President Bressi stated it could be the fumes as well. It would be on an individual basis through variance to address the proximity of whether or not fumes would be in relationship to the other homes. After speaking to the 3 separate professionals, they would recommend leaving it as is on a case-by-case basis with a variance. Councilman Kafton stated he doesn't agree and perhaps the Council, together with the Mayor's office, could put something together that would give regulations.

Attorney Kelly stated there were 6 applications pending before the Zoning Board and 4 were in gated communities. Council President Bressi feels each community is so different. Mr. Shaw stated Lakewood and Manalapan allow them. Councilman Kafton suggested Council obtain a copy of their ordinance. He understands it falls under the health, safety and welfare but what if we have another huge storm with many days without power. We don't want them to jump through hoops to get a generator.

Mayor Reina stated every few months he meets with the Private Residential Advisory Boards and had met with all of the residents from those communities. We promptly addressed, in lieu of what you are requesting, that your clubhouse look into emergency generator features that can run an entire clubhouse. You have a gray area in your bi-laws. But, at least getting the clubhouses up on emergency generators, there is a place where residents can seek shelter. Mr. Shaw stated he is on that committee and when you're talking about dollars of that generator, it goes to the community for vote. You may not get it simply because of the dollars. Mayor Reina stated we are not stagnant on this issue and other circumstances are in the way of getting it at a much faster pace. Emergency generation, part or in whole, is important so people do have a place for medical emergencies. Council President Bressi mentioned if you want a generator right now, you have to apply through a variance.

**MICHAEL YUDKIN – 34 INVERNESS LANE** – I am the Building & Grounds Chairman and am on the Committee for the clubhouse. In the last year, I have lost electricity 5 times from 4 hours to 8 days. Winding Ways was up and running after Superstorm Sandy before we were. My electricity did not come on until 4 ½ days later and others in Westlake came on a day earlier. I got approval from the Board President to quickly act hoping that an ordinance would be allowed. I wanted to have a set of guidelines that require us to identify sound, manufactures requirements, distances, etc. We have over 2500 residents in our community and many need services. You could not sleep in the clubhouse and would exceed the capacity of the clubhouse with all residents. Council President Bressi stated the professionals have reviewed all the specs. If it was changed and you couldn't meet one of those requirements, you would still have to get a variance. It's frustrating and we are not hesitating.

Mayor Reina stated the reason for the generator at the clubhouse was to sustain until we can get the services restored. It is not meant for shelter, it's meant to accommodate those in need at that point. Once the Office of Emergency Management is aware of an upcoming event, we meet prior and address open shelters that can house a great deal of people. We try to help out as much as possible during the event. If your clubhouse was activated, that is that many people less than the Township has to worry about. We have to address emergency management as it appears. Some homes with 5 –10 acres apart had the same problems; they didn't have natural gas. The situations are widespread and we are working with you. Mr. Yudkin feels they need to recognize that Westlake has a number of elderly who may be sick and may not be fully able to go to a facility. It is a significant issue with my neighbors. We request you look into it and I thank you. Hopefully you rule positively to define some of the requirements.

**MARIE DE STEFANO MILLER – 15 CONGRESSIONAL WAY** – I understand that the ordinance is mute. Where the ordinance that governs R1 and R3 can install the same generator. What is the criteria that's used? Who determines the specs? Then do they go to the Building Department for a permit? There is an ability to have standard, but it can be an easier process. Council President Bressi explained the R1 & R3 have a minimum of 50 feet apart. In the PRC the setbacks are so close. Attorney Kelly stated the standards are set by the Township within the Code (not by the manufacturer). Ms. De Stefano Miller stated the Zoning Officer should be making those decisions not the Planning Board. She is also concerned about the safety. Portable generators are less safe than a permanent natural gas generator.

**JOANN PINKHAM - 1 CHRIS ANN COURT** – She updated Mayor Reina on the illegal dumping on Frank Applegate Road. Mr. Aubadi was Court Ordered to have the site cleared by November 26<sup>th</sup>. He did not and was issued a violation. He was to appear in Municipal Court today for these citations. It was postponed until January 10<sup>th</sup> because he wanted to retain a lawyer. In the interim I learned this was a secondary offense in Jackson at another location. His building application has to be heard but the application is still in process. He has now violated 3 Court Orders with this being the 2<sup>nd</sup> location in Jackson. I applaud Jackson for their diligence but it still looks the same. I thank you and appreciate your help and support but we're not there yet.

Mayor Reina stated everyday we have someone go by to check the site. I am in touch daily with residents of Lakewood who keep me informed of what's going on in Lakewood. Attorney Kelly had called me and I told him he (Mr. Aubadi) would be fined. You were told we couldn't hold this against him during his application process. Jackson is not double dealing the cards. The Township is sending him to Court but the Judge was the one that gave him more time. Lakewood is not even cleaned up yet; we are not letting go of this. Ms. Pinkham asked if anyone from the Township will be at Municipal Court on January 10<sup>th</sup>? Mayor Reina advised her Mr. O'Brien is the witness on behalf of the Township. Vice President Updegrave stated to Ms. Pinkham not to apologize for coming to the microphone. We thank you for bringing this to our attention. There's a lot of red tape in the system but we have to get through that to help you. Council President Bressi stated Mr. Torres has called the Attorney General's Office and they are working with Attorney Kelly.

**RAY CATTONAR – 11 FORDHAM COURT** – Is there a cost assessment for thee storm clean up? Council President Bressi stated we still have FEMA working until December 22, 2012. The final cost and actual numbers will be in around January. Mr. Cattonar mentioned at the last Council meeting he saw a resolution withdrawn for emergency appropriate and assumed it was storm related. Mr. Torres feels it's premature to move forward when we're still generating the expenses. That's why it was pulled.

**GARRY BLACK – 76 LEWIS LANE** – Everybody did a magnificent job during the storms. They all deserve applause. He had read the paper and someone wrote in a complaint regarding religious decorations on Township property. They should read the Constitution, as there is no separation of church and state in the Constitution. Congress cannot mandate a religion. People who want to eliminate any type of religious figure, statement or decoration off of public property are the ones in violation of the Constitution. To ban anything of religious belief or item on government property would be in violation of the Constitution.

Mayor Reina reminded everyone tomorrow is the Menorah Lighting at Town Hall at 4:30 p.m. and we invite everyone to attend.
