RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON, COUNTY OF OCEAN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT WITH RENTAL PROPERTY HOLDINGS, LLC, BLOCK 11501, LOT 7.02

WHEREAS, Rental Property Holdings, LLC has previously applied for and received final site plan approval pursuant to Resolution 2023-15 for the property known as Lot 7.02 in Block 11501 as shown on the official tax maps of Jackson Township; and

WHEREAS, said property is located at 130 Pushkin Lane and as a result of the approval, significant modifications are required to the facility in accordance with the approvals granted; and

WHEREAS, said final site plan approval is subject to various outside agency approvals, which outside agency approvals have not yet been received resulting in the applicant not being able to obtain building permits; and

WHEREAS, since the conversion of the prior boarding house involves significant work, the applicant has requested the Township of Jackson enter into an agreement with the applicant which would allow for the issuance of the building permits for work not impacted by any outside agency approval subject to the applicant executing a hold harmless agreement with the Township of Jackson and providing an appropriate performance bond to ensure completion of said improvements; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Jackson has previously authorized such agreements on the condition that no certificate of occupancy may be issued until such time as all outside agency approvals have been obtained and all improvements constructed in accordance with the approvals previously granted; and

WHEREAS, this will allow conversion work to commence as well as site plan work not addressed by or impacted by any outside agency approvals, while at the same time the Township is fully protected even if such approvals are not subsequently received;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, this ____ day of _____, 2023 by the Township Council of the Township of Jackson, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey, as follows:

1. The Township of Jackson hereby authorizes the execution of a hold harmless agreement and authorization for Rental Property Holdings, LLC a/k/a White Oak Center, LLC to be issued construction permits for the subject property subject to the applicant executing an appropriate hold harmless agreement and posting a performance bond in an amount to be determined by the Township Engineer to cover the cost of said improvements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor, Township Clerk and such other Township officials as may be necessary are hereby authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to implement to the intent of this Resolution.

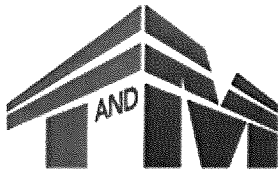

RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF JACKSON REQUESTING GOVERNOR PHILLIP MURPHY CONSIDER THE REAPPOINTMENT OF OCEAN COUNTY PROSECUTOR BRADLEY D. BILLHIMER, TO A SECOND TERM

WHEREAS, Bradley D. Billhimer, was sworn in as Ocean County Prosecutor on October 9, 2018, bringing to the position of Ocean County's top law enforcement official a strong commitment and a fair and balanced approach to the pursuit of justice on behalf of victims, and

WHEREAS, with Ocean County's population continuing to grow and its needs ever evolving, Prosecutor Billhimer continues to increase the office's robust community outreach efforts developing program beneficial to all segments of the County's population from school age children to at-risk youths to the elderly, and

WHEREAS, during his tenure, Prosecutor Billhimer established Ocean County Cares, an Escape the Vape Taskforce, and has hosted a series of Youth Bias Roundtables to assist the youth of Ocean County. Additionally, Prosecutor Billhimer has established a recognizable presence in schools throughout Ocean County by making himself and his staff available to speak to students in their schools reaching more than 20,000 students during the 2022-2023 school year alone through 145 different presentations in over 70 schools about internet safety, social media and bullying.

WHEREAS, Prosecutor Billhimer has focused boundless energy and resources to battling the opioid epidemic that has plagued the County through his three-tiered approach education, prevention, and enforcement establishing innovative programs including the First Step Program, Trident, COTE, and the Michael Camillus Project with funding from Ocean County Helping Hand, and

WHEREAS, Prosecutor Billhimer has established deep roots and created new relationships with Ocean County’s faith-based community through his tireless efforts to strengthen the bonds between law enforcement and the communities served. With focus on community outreach he has established a first of its kind Chaplain Training Program for local law enforcement agencies and additionally, he has established an annual event – Peace Keepers and Prayer Leaders – to bring law enforcement and faith leaders together to have real time discussions on improving relationships, and

WHEREAS, Prosecutor Billhimer has set as a priority stemming the tide of bias intimidation with bias prevention programs that have been recognized both statewide and nationally, successfully launching the “Stand Up to Hate” billboard campaign by communicating to residents that “Hate Has No Home in Ocean County” Prosecutor Billhimer was the first Prosecutor in the State to mandate implicit bias training for all law enforcement officers in Ocean County and also assembled law enforcement executives from across Ocean County for a candid conversation on law enforcement’s relationship with the communities served, and

WHEREAS, Prosecutor Billhimer has worked collaboratively with the Ocean County Board of Commissioners, Ocean County Health Department, Ocean County Sheriff’s Office, Ocean County Chiefs of Police Association, Ocean County Library, Ocean County College, Ocean County Superintendents of Schools Association, Hope Sheds Light, Bright Harbor Healthcare, and Preferred Behavioral Health, to name a few, to ensure public safety, and provide education and resources to the residents of Ocean County, and

WHEREAS, recognizing the importance of partnerships and collaboration, Prosecutor Billhimer has worked to strengthen relationship with local, State, and Federal law enforcement partners by being a willing participant in an ongoing dialogue of collaboration.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the governing body of the Township of Jackson, County of Ocean, State of New Jersey strongly supports the reappointment of Bradley D. Billhimer and urges Gov. Murphy to appoint him to a second five-year term as Ocean County Prosecutor after successfully leading the Prosecutor's Office and navigating through seismic changes in state laws, the COVID-19 pandemic, and the ever changing landscape of the social and criminal justice policy during his current term. And, the governing body expresses its appreciation for his dedication and commitment to assisting the residents of Ocean County and his efforts to ensure the safety of all.
